








Maintenance and repairs

Quinquennial Inspection Report, 2024







Exterior work (1)

Roof	£
Short term maintenance	2,600
Re-roofing	50,000
Repair/replacement of roof timbers	15,000

• Short term:


- Repair and repoint ridges, replace/re-fix defective slates
- Remove moss

Re-roofing, including

- Re-slating
- repairs to rafter feet, eaves timbers
- Renewing lead flashings
- Rebedding verge cappings
- Resetting gutter












Exterior work (2)

Rainwater goods	£
Maintenance	2,250

- Unblock and refix gutters and downpipes
- Redecorate all cast iron rainwater goods



Defective downpipe and saturated stonework.







Exterior work (3)

Repointing	£
Essential short/medium term	26,300
Removal of cement mortar, repointing in lime mortar	60,000


• Short/medium term

- Rebed and repoint vestry gable
 & verge cappings
- Repoint and repair chimney & flashings
- Repoint west gable
 - Including stone sill/mullion repairs
- Repoint west wall of porch
- Other stonework repairs and repointing

Longer term

• Replace all cement mortar with lime

Sapling at top of chimney, defective joints in stonework










Exterior work (4)


Windows	£
Maintenance and repairs	7,400

- Refurbish corroded hoppers
- Refurbish vestry windows
- Repair broken and mismatched glass




• New expert advice: there's more work to be done!

Cracked stone mullion and sill, defective joints to high level stonework

Other work (1)

Interior	£
Replaster and redecorate nave, chancel, vestry ceiling, porch	20,000
Nave/chancel ceiling and other woodwork	2,200

- Remove defective plaster, replace with lime
- Redecorate with breathable paint
- Inspect ceiling, treat with preservative
- Minor repairs and redecoration to dado panelling







What's the reason for the project?

- No toilets
- No baby changing facilities
- No water or drainage in the church
- No facilities for serving refreshments


Along with the failed heating system, this all makes the church less user friendly and welcoming than it needs to be in the 21st century







Possible solution – option 1




- ☑ Discreet, little disruption
- Long trek to the toilet in bad weather. Reduced vestry space







Possible solution – option 2




- ✓ More accessible, vestry space not restricted
- Cramped space around font







Possible solution – option 3



- ☑ Tidy solution, creates new lobby space
- More disruption, less seating (chairs in lobby for funerals etc)








- Budget cost for the development project:
- Around £80,000

So with the repairs from the Quinquennial Report, the Development Project and restoration of the organ, we're looking at around £350,000



The bottom line (1)

- Annual income is typically around £1000 a year less than expenditure
- We are not spending enough on regular maintenance
- We have serious repairs to do
- And a development project to fund

So...

- We need to increase regular income by at least £1,500 a year
- Repairs and development project will cost around £350,000








The bottom line (2)

- We have received a generous £20,000 (and access to gate) from the Knarsdale Estate in exchange for lifting covenant on Old Rectory
- We will need to apply for grant funding
- The more we can put towards the cost ourselves, the more likely grant-givers are able to help us
- 10-15% is a bare minimum, with 30% we are much more likely to be successful
- So we should be aiming to raise another £75,000 or so








Financial support

- Make a regular donation ...
