## Lent

Lent is a season of penitence and preparation. Originally a time of preparation for baptism, its value was soon recognized by established Christians. Lent is traditionally marked by an emphasis on prayer and fasting.

In this season we remember Jesus' forty days of preparation in the wilderness; and we enter into the mystery of Christ's suffering and death, before the glorious victory of Easter.

In keeping with the reflective mood of the season, the church is stripped of flowers and the hangings are in sombre purple.

The same penitential tone marks the prayers and readings. In particular we pray Kyrie Eleison, "Lord, have mercy" (or "Lord, you are merciful") – a prayer which is both a petition and thanksgiving; an acknowledgment of what God has done, is doing, and will continue to do.

The sacrifice of God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart God will not despise. Let us come to the Lord, who is full of compassion, and acknowledge our transgressions in penitence and faith.

May the God of love and power forgive us and free us from our sins, heal and strengthen us by his Spirit, and raise us to new life in Christ our Lord.

- Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.
- All Glory to you, O Lord.

- This is the Gospel of the Lord.
- All Praise to you, O Christ.

All give us strength and hear our prayer.


Or

#### SHARING GOD'S PEACE

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us access to his grace.

#### PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

We remain standing

The Lord is here

All His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

We thank you, God of our ancestors, for in the valley of dry bones you create hearts of flesh quickened by the Spirit's breath.

All We give you thanks and praise.

We thank you, Holy Spirit, that you walk in cloud and fire with your lost and faithless people.

All We give you thanks and praise.

We thank you, Son of Heaven, that you empty yourself of might and glory and set your face towards the fickle crowd, the cruel empire, the faithful despisers.

All We give you thanks and praise.

We welcome you as God's own fool whose cross brings to nothing the violence of the world and reveals another wisdom outside the city walls.

#### All We give you thanks and praise.

Therefore, with all who follow your way, with the traders and tax collectors, the soldiers and prostitutes, and all who caught a glimpse of your glory in the humanity you shared, we worship God's own holiness revealed in sweat and tears:

## All Holy, holy, holy, vulnerable God, you who turn power upside-down, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Creator God, in these last days you have sent us your Son, Jesus, son of Mary, from Nazareth. In word and deed he brought the truth to light and called us to follow in the ways of integrity and discipleship.

When the enemies of life put him to death, you raised him up by your power, and likewise you raise us up and unite us with Christ that we too may be an honoured dwelling place for your Holy Spirit.

So with all your redeemed and thankful people, we dare to proclaim with confidence:

#### All Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

In trust we come to the One in whom is our hope and our salvation, responding to his call and the promise which echoes from the dawn of all time.

May mind and heart be held by your self-giving love as we stand before the cross, approach the empty tomb and greet the One at whose name every knee shall bow; by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all the voices of creation, we worship you, O God, our life-giver, pain-bearer, love-maker:

All Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever.
Amen.

#### THE LORD'S PRAYER

We sit or kneel

We pray the Lord's Prayer, in whichever version or language we wish

 Lord Jesus, remember us in your Kingdom, and teach us to pray:

#### Either

ΑII Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done: on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Or

All Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours,
now and for ever.
Amen.

All In the name of Christ. Amen.


